Organization	Program Description
<b>Conservation Programs</b>	
Community Empowerment Association (CEA), Inc.	CEA Green Brigade is comprised of economically disadvantaged youths from Homewood Brushton and nearby neighborhoods with a mission to green the ghettos by engaging in conservation, restoration and beautification projects.
Garfield Jubilee Association, Inc.	Garfield Jubilee Association will provide summer employment to youth ages 14-21 in conservation related work, cleaning lots in the Garfield community of Pittsburgh as a first step toward green planting.
Student Conservation Association	The Grow Up Green Up Community conservation Crews- Summer 2010 is designed to prepare youth for Green Careers by working on conservation and community service projects in Pittsburgh neighborhoods and City of Pittsburgh Parks.
YMCA of greater Pittsburgh	The E-JISD program is a collaborative that provides education and work experience to economically disadvantaged youth who are at risk of engaging in delinquency and other behaviors contributing to crime and teen parenthood.
YouthPlaces	YouthPlaces will work with disadvantaged youth connected with identified community based partners on potential projects to accomplish conservation and community beautification in their neighborhoods with a focus on developing workforce and life skills.
<b>Internship Programs</b>	
Ace Mentor Program	Ace mentoring places participants with employers in the integrated construction industry. The program encourages students to pursue secondary and post-secondary education in the construction related fields, and develops basic and technical skills through applied work experience.
Bloomfield Garfield Corporation	The program will build upon BGC's experience in youth development to engage 140 youths in six week internships for the summer. Contextual learning, career and work readiness training, tutoring and various activities will be included.
Center that C.A.R.E.S.	The C.A.R.E.S. Youth Internship program is intended to create a well rounded work and learning experience for urban youth that encourages culturally relevant standards of professionalism and excellence.
Garfield Jubilee Association, Inc.	Garfield Jubilee Association will provide summer employment in the form of internships in the construction industry, including positions in construction field offices.

Organization	Program Description
Goodwill of Southwestern Pennsylvania	The Goodwill Summer Youth Employment Program will provide City of Pittsburgh Youth, ages 14-21, paid internships in high growth areas that include a contextual learning experience aspect where youth can explore career options and paths and gain significant relevant work experience.
Hill Dance Academy Theatre (HDAT)	Interns with an eagerness to work arts administration will assist in the office with class schedules, registration, performance/showcase planning and day-to-day routine of assisting instructors, students and parents.
Hill House Association	Hill House will place youth in summer internships centered around agriculture/foods/architecture/arts, education, finance, government, health services, hospitality/tourism, human services and information technology.
Jewish Family and Childrens Service	The Career Development Center of Jewish family and Children's Service is partnering with UPMC, Jewish Association on Aging and Schenley Gardens to provide 15 youths the opportunity to work in the health care field.
LifesWork of Western PA	The LifesWork Summer Employment Program will allow youth an opportunity to gain actual work experience in a real world work setting. Career Development is a central focus and is embedded in the program design.
One Small Step	The One Small Step program will allow youth interns to work along side certified teachers and counselors and learn to assist other students as peer mentors.
Pittsburgh Public Schools Start on Success	Start on Success is a transition-to-employment summer program. It is based on the highly successful year-round program for youth with disabilities at nine Pittsburgh High Schools. Components consist of a summer transition class and paid a internship with local universities, hospitals and businesses.
Wireless Neighborhoods	West End Works will provide opportunities throughout the summer of 2010 for West End high school students to earn a wage, gain valuable work experience and career exposure; and interact with nurturing adults from west end businesses and community organizations.
YouthWorks, Inc.	YouthWorks will provide paid work experience and an opportunity to acquire work readiness skills through its signature JumpStart Success work readiness curriculum. Youth experiencing their first time in the workforce will be placed with community based organizations, where experience is gained before advancement to private sector employment.
